#### ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL 'POTHOLE INITIATIVE'

Essex County Council has once again given each county councillor the chance to put forward priority repairs as part of their "pothole initiative". Each councillor is able use a repair crew in for up to 10 days. As a result Hutton County Councillor Louise McKinlay has

submitted her list to Essex Highways team, having taking into account feedback received from local residents and also residents associations across her division. The work is expected to be actioned over the coming weeks and we will be reporting back to you on progress.



Brentwood Council is currently completing important maintenance work to both Poplars Hall and Poplars Lodge at Hutton Poplars. The external building works on Poplars Hall are now almost complete, and the majority of the scaffolding has now been taken down. There remains

some residual work to be performed on the hall, including legionella related activities. Hutton Poplars Lodge still has some roof works and Poplars Lodge timber works to be completed which is likely to be done by November.
