

ACTIVE TRAVEL Safer, Greener & Healthier

Active Travel is an Essex County Council led initiative to create space for walking and cycling with all the obvious environmental and health benefits.

The proposal locally is to create a segregated cycle route in Brentwood connecting commuters to Shenfield railway station to Brentwood town centre, via a Low Traffic Neighbourhood and the adoption of a School Street, and the introduction of 20 mph speed limits.



Brentwood is one of only five districts in Essex to win a share of COVID phase 2 funding grants resulting in a total of £800,000 with Brentwood Borough Council contributing £131,000 and the remainder from

government. The Project is jointly led by Borough Cllr Jon Cloke and County Cllr Lesley Wagland.
